FROM THE PASTOR.....MY DEAR PARISH FAMILY, this weekend we celebrate the wonderful Solemnity of **EASTER**. For forty days we have been preparing for the time we can sing out once again, **ALLELUIA, JESUS IS RISEN AND WITH US.**" In wanting to say something that would be inspirational for all, I came across some of Pope Francis' words that I think hit the mark most beautifully. He says, "It is the silent night of the disciples who remained numb, paralyzed and uncertain of what to do amid so many painful and disheartening situations," the pope said. "It is also that of today's disciples, speechless in the face of situations we cannot control, that make us feel and, even worse, believe that nothing can be done to reverse all the injustices that our brothers and sisters are experiencing in their flesh." But in the midst of silence, he said, the stone is rolled away from Jesus' tomb and there comes "the greatest message that history has ever heard: 'He is not here, for he has been raised. Jesus' empty tomb should fill Christians with trust in God and should assure them that God's light "can shine in the least expected and most hidden corners of our lives." ""He is not here ... he is risen!" This is the message that sustains our hope and turns it into concrete gestures of charity," the pope said. It is a call to revive faith, broaden one's horizons and know that no one walks alone. "To celebrate Easter is to believe once more that God constantly breaks into our personal histories, challenging our conventions, those fixed ways of thinking and acting that end up paralyzing us," he said.

Over the next week, the church will be celebrating the **OCTAVE OF EASTER**. The next 8 days are considered as one day of the great Easter feast. For 40 or so days we have been preparing for the joy of Easter. Fasting, penance, almsgiving, and prayer were the items of the day. Now, we are to celebrate and rejoice in the presence of the Risen Lord among us. I pray that the Easter joy may not be diminished and that we are able to revel in the love of the Father. That was the message of Jesus – we have a God who loves us and will always love us. May the alleluia we sang for the first time at the Easter Vigil be sung within our hearts always!
