Dates were set for the beginning and ending of the construction; appliances for the kitchen were reserved and purchased; plans for the air conditioning are being finalized; plans for the new secure entrance into the school are also being finalized. As of this typing we have pledged \$1,375,000.00, almost of which \$1,000.000 has been received in cash. After everything is finished I am sure parishioners will be very proud of the changes and improvements. However, I do have a request. If you have not already contributed to this project, please consider doing so. We are undertaking this massive project for the good of our school children, especially for their safety. There are additional envelopes in the baptistery for those who want to help. As a matter of fact, I received a check for \$500.00 from visitors from Ohio who were so impressed with our Catholic Schools Mass that they wanted to help out in this campaign. They write, *"Fr. Dadey, as a visitor to OLCVS on the Sunday of Catholic Schools Week, we were so moved by your sermon regarding the importance of Catholic education that we just had to send this contribution to help with your improvement project. We hope this will help reach your goal. God Bless."* Here we have visitors, not parishioners who are helping us. Could I ask parishioners who have not contributed so far to kindly consider doing so? Your help will ensure that children for many years will continue to receive the best education and school environment for many years to come. What a wonderful legacy to leave behind!
