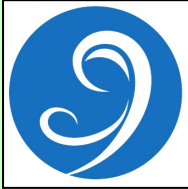

FROM THE PASTOR.....MY DEAR PARISH FAMILY, FROM THE PASTOR.....MY DEAR PARISH FAMILY, do you have an Advanced Medical Directive or a Health Care Proxy? Do you understand the basics of medical ethics and serious medical illness decision making from a Catholic perspective? Is there someone you trust to help make medical decisions for you if you are not able? What medical decision-making advice can you give family or friends that is in line with Church teaching when their loved one is a terminally ill patient? It is a very difficult time in the life of a family trying to understand what is permissible or not permissible, according to Catholic teaching. Therefore, under the guidance of Pete Roy, there will be a discussion entitled, **END OF LIFE MEDICAL DECISION MAKING – A CATHOLIC PERSPECTIVE.** Parishioners are invited to join me and Pete Roy, MD on Tuesday, March 19th for a presentation on Catholic medical decision making. As always, your priests will be in attendance at the services so please be understanding if we are not quickly available at some of the times. On a special note, the Sunday penance service at OLV will be the last scheduled service at OLV before Easter. Since it falls on Palm Sunday it is our hope that we will then be prepared to celebrate Holy Week with a heart open to the love of God that we will experience throughout the various services.

My Lenten class, **JESUS, HIS MISSION, AND MESSAGE,** will continue to be held on Mondays from 7:00 – 8:00 PM in the Activities Center. Even if you might have missed a session, you are still welcome to come.

This Sunday afternoon at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament in Altoona, we will **celebrate the Rite of Election or Enrollment of Names for those who are unbaptized and the Rite of Calling the Candidates to Continuing Conversion for those who are baptized,** with our Candidates and Catechumens. This is a very significant and important step in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. It is usually celebrated on the first Sunday of Lent at the local diocesan Cathedral, led by the local bishop. All of the Catechumens and Candidates, their Godparents (for Catechumens), and Sponsors (for Catechumens and Candidates) gather together on this day. The Church formally ratifies the Catechumens' readiness for the Sacraments of Initiation and the Candidates' readiness to be received into full Communion with the Catholic Church. In turn, the Catechumens – from now on known as the **ELECT**– publicly acknowledge their desire to receive the Sacraments of Initiation, and the Candidates' desire to be received into full Communion with the Catholic Church. We congratulate our Candidates and Catechumens and ask you to please continue to pray for them and they journey to the Easter Vigil: Sherry Houtz, Brian Hyman, Anna Zhang (Catechumens); Gabrielle Robinson and Michael Robinson (Candidates).
